Camperdown Easter 2019



YVA members, Keiron Hampson, Graham Jenner, Daniel Wheeler, Mario Schembri and myself, make an annual Easter pilgrimage to Camperdown, an hour west of Colac, to hurl gliders into the air some 400 feet above the ex volcanic Lake Bullen Merri. Fortunately being surrounded by trees, the caravan park is protected from the often-strong winds. Walking out the back of the campsite gives access to the most commonly used flying area "the Point", view above picture. This is one of three sites available round the rim of the volcano.

- The Point, out the back of the Caravan park, for West to Southerly wind
- The Doctor's, a private property, for Northerlies
- The Dairy farm for North East to South East winds

Both the Doctor's and the dairy farm require permission to access and fly. This year we were able to fly from the dairy farm for the first time in about 6 years. As well as spectacular views, it is the most open for easy landings. This year we convinced Dennis Travassaros to come down he said he's come for the day and stayed three. I have a feeling he'll be back next year reading some of his Facebook posts...

I had my new RCRCM Sunbird to maiden this year while Daniel and Mario had bought Elf slope soarers produced in Queensland and collected while we were attending the Masters. They had purchased three, the third for Mario's brother Chris. Mario had worked like a Trojan since returning from Queensland to have all three completed for Easter. The weather started warm but by Monday had cooled right down. In my excitement to get to Camperdown I forgot to pack jeans and a jacket but it wasn't snowing so it wasn't cold... On Saturday we were flying at the Doctor's into a Northerly that varied in strength and lift for a while. Mario launched his Southern Sailplanes something-or-other just as the lift was abateing. Ten minutes later he was landing at the edge of the lake way down below and to the right of us. We selected the correct property, more by luck than judgement; it had landed in and with permission drove down to collect the wayward glider. Tracks leading down the steep slope guided us in a safe manner down to the 'beach'.



Mario some 400 feet below his launch point up on the slyline by the trees. When there's sink, they sink! We're about 50 feet from the lake shoreline here. Mario and Daniel's Elf gliders are around 1100gms and both agreed there may be oportunities to reduce the weight and therefore improve their performance. My Sunbird, same size as the Elf, had weighed in at 865gms and although set up with reduced throws flew magnificantly. I deployed full flaps for landing which results it coming in at walking pace into a 20knot breeze. I got this approach a bit wrong on Monday and pulled the flaps up too quickly resulting in a mose dive into the ground from about five feet. Although no structural damage was done, I did break the starboard aileron horn that curtailed any further flying.



New to Camperdown this year was F3A pilot and fellow club member Dennis Travassaros who drove down initially for a day but stayed 3. He had a large F5J electric glider that one of the local Wedgetails eyed up while flying at the Doctor's. Dennis turned up the speedie and with a half Cuban presented the model at the Eagle head on. At this the Eagle turned tail and left. He also brought along his HobbyKing Nemesis that had been equiped with a go-pro with which he produced and posted some high speed video of his flying during the weekend. There were also another four or five flyers from other clubs who also partake in glider guiding as provide much valued experience and advice when some of us can't see the wood for the trees; my use of flaps being an example. Graham Jenner and Keiron Hampson rounded out the YVA presence. They have also made the journey for a number of years and this year did a little floatplane flying off the lake. Graham was heading off to a floatplane event the following weekend a little further up the road at Lake Bolac. This to is an annual event with camping taking place around the lake edge; note to self, build a floatplane!

Insurance question re giving the grandkids a go

I was asked to follow up on a question about bringing Grandchildren along for a fly and their standing re insurance in the event of an accident. Below are the questions I asked Joe Finnochiaro with his responses in red.

Only of our members asked me the following last Saturday.

He has a grandson, about 6 years old, who's showing interest in RC models. He would like to bring him out for a fly but...

1. Is he covered by our insurance?

Yes, all ages

2. If he had an accident and caused damage to property, car or something in the pits is he covered?

Personal accident from age of 2

3. Is he restricted to the 3 visit rule?

Yes, If he continues to fly after his 3 or 4 visits, then you would expect for the junior to join the club like any other visitor. This is up to the club to administer.

So there you are, if your grandkids are showing some interest, they're covered by the MAAA insurance for three visits.

Ensure every person attending the club field signs in and out of the register book. Remember the last person to leave the field has to check that the clubroom is locked and secure. Lock the front gate on departure.


Clean up after yourself if you use the clubroom facilities, ensure the gas bottle is turned off after use.
