

Radio Interference - Greg Egan

Bottom line first - Do NOT fly close to radio transmission towers.

A number of us have aircraft types, which may be flown without the need for a runway. There is a popular slope soaring site at Mount Hollback outside of Creswick, which has been used for slope soaring for decades with little interference from the microwave link equipment installed there. Recently several aircraft have been lost and is possible that the cause may be a National Broadband Network (NBN) radio hub installed to provide service to rural users where existing copper cable is inadequate and fibre optic cable prohibitively expensive. It turns out that there are many many of these NBN hubs one also being at Healesville. It is unlikely the Healesville hub will cause difficulties

for us at our field, as it is several kilometres away. If there were to be interference then it would be most likely at altitude above the ridge above the dam. Yes I know we are not supposed to be flying there. In the case of Hollowback the launch areas are within 100M of the towers and the power levels are so high that the 2.4GHz receivers we no most commonly use are simply blotted out. There are no subtleties involved here, just brute force.

CASA Drone Regulations - Greg Egan

You don't fly drones correct? Drones are those noisy things lots of motors and no wings? No, unfortunately all unmanned aircraft are now deemed to be drones. Drones are things to be feared after all as many as zero people have been killed directly by drones.

With a worldwide media driven frenzy and political response to this CASA is implementing new regulations as they apply to drones i.e. your aircraft. To give CASA its due it was one of the first, if not the first, to implement unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) policy in the form of CASR 101. CASR 101 very carefully separate the domain of model aircraft flying for fun from flying for money. CASA

knew and respected the model aircraft fraternity and its role in aviation way back before manned flight. The MAAA have worked with CASA to retain some sense of proportion to the domain.

Speaking of these fun machines, I heard that certain member's equiped with these have been practising things like limbo for club comps, others have improved the motor and added a bigger speed controller...

Bemsilk lining.

After the show and tell of my Avro Avian, I had a questions about Bemsilk and it's application. I keep referring to this, incorrectly, as Bemsilk nylon, which it isn't. It is available from Spotlight in an array of colours and is applied to model aircraft with dope although other modellers have other methods of application. It is 100% Acetate and it is, just like Deep Purple's classic album, made in Japan. With the array of colours available, covering gliders to suit your own scheme is easy. Nitrate dope will shrink it nice and tight

My preferred method for an open structure is to cut an oversize piece and iron it to remove any wrinkles. I dope the periphery of the area the piece is to go, lay the bemsilk on and spray it with water. I then dope around the edges of the piece and pull it tight working my way all around the edge. This is my method and others will do it differently and use alternate methods of adhesion. Once the bemsilk has dried out, it will be tight, continue until the model is covered then two or three coats of dope and the job is complete. One thing to be wary of it not to leave the covered model too long with dry bemsilk on before doping as it will absorb moisture and become slack.
