House Keeping

Ensure every person attending the club field signs in and out of the register book. Remember the last person to leave the field has to check that the clubroom is locked and secure. Lock the front gate on departure.

Clean up after yourself if you use the clubroom facilities, ensure the gas bottle is turned off after use.

Back in the building room...

I've been working on completing Daniel's Yak 54, installing the canopy and cowling. I decided to split the canopy into three pieces, permanently mounting the front and rear portions and having the centre section removeable for access to the equipment inside the fuselage. Before I could cut the canopy, the front and rear fuselage fairings blending the canopy to the fuselage needed to be made. These were cut from aluminium litho plate, annealed and bent to shape. These are fixed in place with 2mm CSK screws and nuts. My next task was to make the front and rear bows. I settled on laminating them with 0.8mm ply but first, needed to determine their shape. I laid some masking tape over the parting lines on the canopy and then carefully cut along the edge of the tape using my dremmel, photo 1.



By wrapping a piece of paper over the canopy and drawing along the cut edge onto the paper I had the curvature of the bow required to fit. This was repeated for the rear bow. Now adding 6mm to either side of those lines I could produce the templates required to use to cut the ply. See photo 2. Laying the canopy's cut edge on a piece of paper I drew around it to produce the shape of the form blocks required for the front and rear bows, photo 3. The form blocks were cut from 6mm mdf. Two of the form blocks needed to be slightly larger than their mating half to allow for the internal shape of the canopy. Once stuck together as pairs they were sanded to give a good fit to the inside surface of the canopy pieces then screwed to an old cutting block. The sanding process was very much hit and miss in trying to get the taper right and produce a nice fit to the 'glass'. The bows were laid up using PVA and clamped to the form blocks with metal brackets I made to steel strapping, photo 4. Once the glue had dried the clamps were removed and both front and rear faces sanded. I then needed to cut the bows in half. Photo 5 shows my solution for this which took a little while as my piller drill only has one speed it will work at... Photo 6 shows a completed.



The next challenge was to fix the bows to the pieces of canopy. Photo 7 shows the rear most bow in position but not fixed in. Similarly, Photo 8 shows the front bow

Rivetting the bows into place with a lithoplate outer bow, forming the outer frame, seemed like a good idea. The lithoplate bows were cut using the templates from photo 2. Carefully marking the rivet positions and drilling for 1/16th inch rivets was easy enough, I annealed the brass rivets to help installation. Tapping the rivets down caused one or two of them to split the ply bows as they expanded in compression from having their tails formed. This was on the front canopy bow. I will complete the last 3 bows with 10BA nuts and bolts with their heads filed to a dome before installation. Currently I'm waiting for the local Live steam supplier to get more 10BA stock in. Next month I'll babble on about the cowling installation.

Frank Murphy has finally sorted his De Havilland Hornet and has it flying sweatly. Initially plagued with engine vibration problems, he designed and had made some spinner backplate supports and allowed the engines to spin up to a descent rpm and fly the model with authority. He sent me this image of it on finals. I for one look forward to seeing it fly this coming Saturday at out Haydn Hampson / Frank Curzon Scale day.



Frank is currently working on completing a 1/6th scale SE5A from the Dennis Bryant Elite plan. Just the thing to chase around my 1/6th Italian Balilla A1 figther once its referbishment is complete.
