Lost model...

I can only recall three occasions during my modelling career where pilots have lost the model during flight.

- 1970 my dad took me to the local radio club field. This is it I thought, the end of control-line ②. Some rookie lost his trainer, last seen heading off to Stevenage town centre with him running down the hill after it. "Are we doing R/C?" I asked, "not now we're not" was the reply.
- About 2008, Tony Grieger and I were flying gliders off Glenfern Road when he
 put down his Tx to put his coat on. 20 seconds later his glider was awol. He did
 get it back one week later, it landed in a tree in someone's garden in Upway. The
 guy realised where it had come from and returned it the following Sunday.
- The latest involves our own club member Tom Bloodworth. His bright Orange old timer was doing its thing against a clear blue sky after we reopened the field. Tom got distracted and a quick "hello" with a fellow member resulted in Tom's model wandering off to seek pastures new.

These things are bad enough when they happen but when they're members of our club, they find themselves in the running for the Holy Cow award! Currently we have three nominations as potential 2020 recipients.

Back in the building rooms of our far-flung club members... Bill Wheeler

My Mini Hots has flown, powered by a DC Sabre 1.5cc diesel. I had some initial trouble getting it to run. After dismantled the engine and found the contra piston was stuck in its position. I gently tapped it out to the top of the liner and reassembled the engine. The following weekend the engine ran really well working the contra in slowly until the engine fired up. With no excuses remaining the tank was refilled, the engine restarted, and Daniel launched the model. This was a little hairy as the engine doesn't pull the model quite like the electric motors in the Assassins. It climbed away coughing and spluttering, well out of trim but going well. The only thing with not having a throttle control is that it could become a glider anywhere in the circuit you're flying. I just need Daniel and Bailey to complete theirs now.

I also flew my Ansaldo A.1 Balilla a few weeks ago. The c of g was a little far aft resulting in free flight zooms when the speed built up. Halfway around the circuit I cut the engine I held the nose down to turn to the field but again as the speed built up, she zoomed. The bottom of the final zoom finished a foot above the ground and the long grass off the edge of the runway caught the model. It sustained a little damage to the port lower wing panel and requires about 80gms of lead in the nose to fly again. Other than the c of g she felt really nice to fly. Built from a free plan and at 1/6th scale it is powered by an OS FS62V. The refurbishment required a change from 0.8mm ply fuselage to 0.4mm and was well worth the effort. Like most of my models, I build it because of the colour scheme and the challenge of reproducing the artwork.



The colour scheme is from the restoration of a WWI survivor at the Tino Sana Museum in Bergamo, Italy and was flown by Major Antonio Locatelli. Fortunately, there were plenty of photos taken all around the aircraft to download allowing me to complete the model.

Fellow member Mario has completed another turbine jet in recent times which he finally got to test fly and the Bendigo club under the watchful eye of Turbine Inspector Andrew Thomas. Mario had tried the previous week at the Northern Flying Group but the field was far too soggy for the model to achieve take off speed. For those unfamiliar with the Bendigo field, it is a huge flat sheep paddock. The model is a 'Next' sport jet, powered by a 10kg turbine. A few details on the model.

Airframe weight before finishing = 4.87kg Model weight ready to go less fuel = 13.7kg
