Back in the building rooms of our far-flung club members.

#### Me

Some time ago Daniel gave me a Yak 55 to finish off for him. This has moved very slowly as I tried to fit it in with the Avro Avian, then the Miles Magister and the NEO Stage. The problem is progress slows down as I move from one project to the next. I decided to stop all work on the Magister and Stage and get on and complete the Yak. I have a little business creating paint stencils and vinyl stickers which is moving along quite nicely and found myself having to make some stencils for the Yak. This is my first real attempt at doing this sort of thing for myself. All previous models bar the Avion and a Mick Reeves Fournier (some 30 years ago) have been hand painted. I have a spray gun that came with the compressor and used it to fill, prime and undercoat the model. I bought, for the Avian, a smaller touch up gun from Supercheap which along with my

HobbyKing Airbrush has worked well in spaying this model. The biggest piece of the puzzle has been figuring out what colours to paint when to minimise paint build up. I use Metamark vinyl which comes in two colours for stencils; a blue for "rough" surfaces e.g. fabric covered and yellow for "smooth" surfaces. I Googled the sponsors shown on the full size (Sukhoi), fluffed around in photoshop to clean the up the jpg files then imported them into VinylMaster to size and cut the stencils. After doing some online research re masking tape, I settled on OTTO Washi tape from Officeworks. This tape is paper, quite thin and transparent. It gives a beautiful edge and does not peel any previously applied paint when removed due to being low tack. It can also remain in place quite a while with no tendency to peel or curl. But, as they say, the proof of the pudding is in the eating...

Here's a few progress shots of the wings.





Model with white undercoat to make the colours pop. Stencils ready...



Black was applied first. Fortis mask was applied to the L/E then the wing masked and the black sprayed. Once the paint had dried the mask was removed to reveal the white.



Black leading edge masked using the Washi tape the masked off with paper. The centre of the wing is to remain whits so that was also masked off before applying the red and orange.





All masking removed, I had to add the REPSOL over the white. The height of the stencil was cut to fit neatly between the Orange and Red and aid alignment.

Paper hid the red and orange while the blue was spayed over the REPSOL stencil. It actually took a few coats of Blue to give it a solid look. As can be seen from the picture the blue can still be seen through at this point. The process was repeated to both sides of both wing panels.



Wing panels completed, same both top and bottom, feeling chuffed with myself. One thing I had not noticed but my wife did, the red crosses the ailerons at different positions. Rookie.

The paints are auto acrylics from Eastern Auto Paints in Bayswater. The mix I used is 60/40 thinners to paint. Next month, the fuselage.
